INTRODUCTION

The ROMEO-RS features a revolutionary hybrid housing design, with an integrated steel chassis surrounded by high strength polymer (ROMEO-RS = Reinforced Steel). While polymer reduces weight and increases recoil shock resistance, critical mechanical interfaces are reinforced with metal for added rigidity and durability. A molded glass aspheric lens provides distortion-free clarity and a side control button makes reticle adjustments quick and easy. Several reticle options are available and feature the latest highly-efficient point source emitters with 8 brightness levels. A side battery tray means never needing to remove the optic from the firearm to change the battery and MOTAC (Motion Activated Illumination) automatically shuts the optic off after two minutes of inactivity, then instantly turns it back on when motion is detected.

Designed, developed, tested, and assembled in the USA using state of the art robotic processes, the ROMEO-RS open reflex sights are loaded with features and cutting edge technology at an affordable price. The COMPACT model fits all Shield RMSc footprints and the PRO model fits all DeltaPoint PRO footprints.





OPERATION

Installing the Battery

NOTE

Failure to properly torque the security screw in a clockwise (CW) direction to 4 in-lbs could lead to an ingestion hazard of the coin battery, intermittent LED illumination or allow moisture into the battery compartment.

The battery tray is located on the right side of the optic and is secured with a T5 Torx screw.

- Using a T5 Torx driver, loosen the security screw and pull out the battery tray.
- Install a fresh CR1632 battery, positive side facing up, in the battery tray. While holding the battery in place with a finger, slide the battery tray back into the housing.
- Tighten security screw to 4 in-lbf. (or until the screw meets resistance, plus an additional 1/8 turn).





Turning Sight On and Off

- Turn the sight ON by pressing the Control Button for over one second. Turn
 the sight OFF by repeating the same procedure.
- FOR CIRCLE/DOT MODELS ONLY From ON, press and hold the Control Button for over three seconds to enter reticle change mode. The reticle will briefly turn off, then back on in a flashing state. While the reticle is flashing (there is a five-second window), press and release the Control Button to change the reticle. Each press and release of the Control Button will cycle between the three reticle options. After five seconds of no button presses, the displayed reticle will lock in and stop flashing. Any time the optic is turned off via the Control Button or via MOTAC, it will turn back on in the last reticle option and at the last brightness setting used. The reticle options are:
 - 2 MOA red dot surrounded by a 32 MOA red circle
 - 2 MOA red dot only
 - 32 MOA circle only

- The ROMEO-RS features MOTAC (Motion Activated Illumination System). If the illuminated reticle does not detect motion for two minutes, it automatically shuts off. The instant the optic detects motion, it powers on, returning to the previous brightness and reticle setting.
- The ROMEO-RS has eight brightness settings. From ON, press and release the Control Button to raise the brightness by one level. Each press and release of the Control Button raises the brightness by one level. When the top brightness level is reached, the reticle will flash multiple times. Subsequent button presses will lower the brightness one level per button press until the lowest level is reached. The reticle will flash multiple times to indicate the lowest level has been reached, and subsequent button presses will raise the brightness levels again.
- LOW BATTERY INDICATOR When the optic is turned ON from the OFF state
 using the Control Button, if the reticle slowly strobes several times, it indicates
 that the battery needs to be replaced and that there is approximately 24 hours
 of runtime left (at high setting). Replace the battery with a fresh CR1632 as
 soon as possible.

Mounting the Sight

The ROMEO-RS comes in two models, COMPACT and PRO.

The COMPACT model is designed to mount to any firearm or mount that uses the Shield™ RMS-c mounting footprint. The PRO model is designed to mount to any firearm or mount that uses the DeltaPoint® PRO mounting footprint. Remove any pistol optic cover plate from the pistol slide (refer to the firearm owner's manual). Ensure the threaded mounting holes in the mounting surface are clean and free from any debris or thread locker compound.

The ROMEO-RS comes with mounting screws for the most common pistols in the industry. The mounting screws are labeled with the part number and correspond to the following mounting applications and torque values:

If mounting the ROMEO-RS to an aluminum slide, mount, or adapter plate, see the slide/mount/plate manufacturer's torque specifications. For other SIG SAUER optics-ready pistols not listed above, contact SIG SAUER Customer Service for mounting screw information, torque values, and mounting quidance.

Select the proper mounting screws and test them first to ensure they thread smoothly into the mounting surface holes. Set the ROMEO-RS onto the mounting surface, lining up any protruding recoil bosses in the mounting surface with the recoil lug witness holes in the bottom of the optic. Insert the mounting screws through the optic mounting screw holes and slowly thread them into the threaded holes in the mounting surface, while putting forward pressure (toward the muzzle) on the optic housing. Torque the mounting screws to the appropriate torque value. It is strongly recommended to use an inch-pound torque wrench.



SIGHT ADJUSTMENTS AND ZEROING

CAUTION

DO NOT FORCE THE ADJUSTMENT SCREWS BEYOND THEIR LIMITS OF TRAVEL. DOING SO MAY PERMANENTLY DAMAGE THE OPTIC. DO NOT TURN THE WINDAGE SCREW COUNTERCLOCKWISE BEYOND THE SCREW HEAD BEING FLUSH WITH THE SURFACE OF THE HOUSING.

NOTE

The windage and elevation adjustment screws use friction within the housing to hold them tightly in place so that the optic does not lose zero during recoil. Therefore, they require sufficient force to break the friction and start turning them in either direction. Once they begin turning, much less force is required.

Elevation Adjustments – The elevation adjustment screw is located on top of the rear deck of the optic, just behind the mount screw holes. To raise the point of impact, use the supplied T5 Torx wrench to turn the adjustment screw clockwise. To lower the point of impact, turn the adjustment screw counterclockwise. A 1/4 rotation of the adjustment screw is equal to approximately 10 MOA of travel.

Windage Adjustments – The windage adjustment screw is located on the left side of the optic, just behind the control button. To move the point of impact right, use the supplied T5 Torx wrench to turn the adjustment screw counterclockwise. To move the point of impact left, turn the screw clockwise. A 1/4 rotation of the adjustment screw is equal to approximately 10 MOA of travel.

NOTE

The directional arrows near the adjustment screws indicate the direction the bullet impacts will move. They do not indicate the direction the reticle is moving. One full rotation of either the windage or elevation adjustment screw is equal to approximately 40 MOA of travel. Therefore, 1/4 of a rotation in either direction is approximately 10 MOA of travel, which equals 1 inch at 10 yards, 1.5 inches at 15 yards, or 2.5 inches at 25 yards.

Zeroing – When mounted, the ROMEO-RS should be sighted in just like a rifle optic. A precise group (minimum five rounds) should be shot at a cardboard or paper target. Compare the Point of Aim (POA) held on the target with the Point of Impact (POI) of the rounds on the target. Use the windage and elevation adjustments to bring the point of aim together with the point of impact. It is recommended that initial sightin procedure be done with a paper target at 5-7 yards, before moving the target to greater distances for final zeroing.

- Cleaning Keep glass lens clear by using a clean, soft lens cloth. To avoid scratches in the surface of the lens coatings, be sure to remove any brass particles, dirt, dust, or carbon buildup from the glass before wiping the surface. Use compressed air to blow away debris and a cotton swab lightly soaked in Isopropyl Alcohol to remove carbon.

TROUBLESHOOTING

POI Changes between groups when shooting from a single set distance

- Check that the mounting screws are torqued to the correct specification. See MOUNTING THE SIGHT ON PAGE 14.
- · Check for variations in ammunition brand, bullet weight, and velocity specs.
- Check/clean the firearm.

Reticle not illuminated

- Press and hold the control button for over 1 second. Continue to press and release
 the control button to make sure the illuminated reticle is not in one of the lowest
 illumination levels, which can be difficult to see in bright environments.
- Ensure the battery is installed properly (+ facing up).
- Make sure the battery tray security screw is tightened to 4 in-lbf.
- · Replace the battery.

Illuminated reticle suddenly changes shape or becomes blurry

 Use compressed air to blow out the emitter area, located on top of the sight between the two mount screw holes.
